Comedy

- Dionysian rites
- Old Comedy ca. 480-400 BCE
 Extravagant burlesque employing gods and heroes
 Vilification of public or political targets
 Sexual and scatological innuendo
 Practitioners: Aristophanes and many others
- Middle Comedy ca. 400-350
 Like Old Comedy but with more general targets
- New Comedy ca. 350-260
 Use of stock characters; comedic love
 Lampoons contemporary morality, everyday man
 Practitioners: Menander; Plautus and Terence

































Natural philosophy Leucippus and Democritus Everything is composed entirely of various imperishable, indivisible elements called atoms

- Hippocrates
 Father of Western medicine
 Use of prognosis and clinical observation, the systematic categorization of diseases, or the formulation of humoral theory

Nomos vs. physis

- Nomos (convention)

 - Is morality merely arbitrarily dictated by society?
 Protagoras: "Man is the measure of all things"
- Physis (nature)
 - Is there a higher sanction to be found in something else, like the natural world?
 - \bullet A search for ways to identify natural laws of morality and justice—universal truths
